LIBRARY ELECTRONIC ASSISTANCE DROGRAM

Do you wonder if you are using your electronic device properly? Are you concerned you aren't taking advantage of every option it offers? Would you like help understanding how to access information on your computer or Laptop, your Kindle, iPad, or iPhone? FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY would like to help!

Available at seven of the ten Collier County Libraries, funded by FRIENDS, with the approval of The Board of County Commissioners, LEAP (Library Electronic Assistance Program) was formed two years ago. Local students were hired and continue to be available to help Library Card holders with their electronic devices.

Librarians at Golden Gate, Headquarters, Immokalee, Marco Island, Naples Regional, South Regional, and Vanderbilt Beach Branches have trained students to assist Library members. Tasks such as downloading books or magazines, using data bases and e-mailing, familiar to a generation for whom electronic devices are second nature, are capably explained to patrons.

Recent reports from Library branches substantiate the success of the program. At Naples Regional, Manager, Marilyn McKay reports patrons said student, Diana, allowed them to "finally really understand" how to use their electronic devices. April Ristau, Vanderbilt Beach Library Manager, felt student, Klaudia, was indispensable, performing tasks allowing patrons to develop confidence in technology.

At Golden Gate Library, Manager David Chalick, said Jesse, a patient and technologically able student, liked solving the challenges of solving problems. Jamie Reilly, Marco Island Branch Manager noted it was beneficial to teach patrons about devices using a one-on-one approach.

FRIENDS is monitoring the progress of this innovative program. They will continue to fund and, hopefully, increase the program at branch locations. FRIENDS is particularly gratified students are excited at the enthusiasm of participants. An additional benefit to the younger members of our community is having exposed them to the rewards and satisfaction of helping others.

FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY has scheduled Amy Hill Hearth, author of MISS DREAMSVILLE AND THE COLLIER COUNTY WOMEN'S LITERARY SOCIETY, to discuss her latest book at a B & B C Breakfast on Wednesday, February 10, 2016.

At a FOL Breakfast in 2013, after speaking about her book, Ms. Hearth was asked if she had plans to write a sequel. She paused briefly and then asked if the audience would be interested in a novel which continued the story. When the audience erupted with applause, she had her response!

The result, MISS DREAMSVILLE AND THE LOST HEIRESS OF COLLIER COUNTY, was published on September 8 of this year. The familiar characters from the first book are again part of an engrossing narrative, set in 1964 in Naples.

Ms. Hearth, known for Historical Fiction, is the bestselling New York Times author of HAVING OUR SAY: THE DELANY SISTERS' FIRST 100 YEARS; performed as a play on Broadway and later made into a film. She became a close friend of Sarah Louise and Annie Elizabeth Delany and wrote about them in later novels.
